

Devin has been spending time in a new Mediterranean restaurant that opened near their neighborhood. It is a place where the local Muslim community meets and eats. He recently met a man that was making deliveries to the restaurant. The young man likes to pick up delivery jobs from the Middle Eastern restaurants, so he can visit his friends who work there. I was introduced as "Devin who works for the church" an Issam asked more about what that entailed. He asked if I did this, so I would know I would go to heaven. I explained that good works would not get me into heaven, but rather out of thankfulness to God for paying for our sins. These are the conversations I like to have, and they are usually receptive to hearing about my faith. Please be in prayer for several of my friends who have been asking more about Jesus Christ lately. I also have three Syrian friends who are having some health issues and could use extra prayers.

Michael and Whitney in Chicago with Navigators

Michael is currently working with a refugee (Luke*) from Iraq. They met during the Shi'a holiday of Ashura. He has shared passages from the bible with him, to help him overcome feelings of frustrations and concerns about life. Luke reads from an Arabic bible, but the translation is not good. Michael read with him from a better translation of the Arabic bible and it came alive for him. Luke had been studying to be a physicist in Baghdad, but his hopes for a normal future were dashed by the constant violence around him. Michael took him to the Physics department at the University of Illinois in Chicago to see if his dream could come alive again. He was excited to pursue this opportunity at first but thought it would just be better to have a full-time job, settle down and have a family. Michael is encouraging Luke to apply for the physics program and get a full-time job simultaneously. Please be in prayer for Michael and Luke to be able to study the bible in Arabic and to see the possibilities of his future.

- Meeting opened with prayer.
- Motion passed to accept the Consent Agenda as presented with the following items approved:
 - Minutes past meetings and Email Votes for May and June:
 - May and June Finance Reports for General Fund Account, Storehouse Account, Special Projects Money Market Account, and Investment Account;
 - 3. Benevolence Committee Reports, May and June;
 - 4. Missions Committee Reports, May and June.
- POI: Council acknowledged receipt of an email dated July 1, 2018, in which Kim Wedekind resigned from the Church Council, Benevolence Committee, and the Investment Committee effective immediately, due to change in job location and desire to worship in that area with his family.
- Motion passed to cover the \$40 registration fees for Grace volunteers/ministry leaders who have been invited to attend the Calvary Chapel Heartland Conference at Grace in September, and to cover half of the cost for other Grace attendees and allow them to register for \$20 each.
- Motion passed to accept Scholarship Committee's recommendations as presented and to allocate \$2750 from the Memorial Scholarship Fund to award eleven student applicants \$250 each for the Fall 2018 Semester.
- Hope Church KC request was reviewed and tabled for prayer.
- Meeting adjourned; Next meeting, Tuesday, Aug. 21.

- Meeting opened with prayer.
- Motion passed to accept the Consent Agenda as presented with the following items approved:
 - Minutes of July meeting and Email Votes with the following clarification: Calvary Chapel Heartland Conference fees will also be waived for all Grace staff and volunteers who work or serve in some capacity during the Conference. Their expenses will be covered by the Conference budget.
 - July Finance Reports for General Fund Account, Storehouse Account, Special Projects Money Market Account, and Investment Account;
- 3. Missions Committee Report for August Meeting.
- Motion passed to cover the cost of replacing Pastor Jones' missing laptop computer from the Office Capital Outlay budget, and to deal with any future losses of church property on a case by case basis.
- Motion passed to update the Investment Fund Policy as requested by the Finance Committee in order to clarify the method used to figure the annual amount that is to be withdrawn from the Fund for ministry purposes.
- Motion passed to send a sponsorship letter of support for Pastor Jason Davis and Hope Church KC to the Association of Related Churches as drafted.
- Motion passed to allocate up to \$8700 from the Storehouse Account, following negotiations with Filters of Hope, to pay for all or part of the 10 American Airline tickets that FOH purchased for the Grace Haiti Mission Trip that was cancelled due to a US Government travel ban.
- Motion passed to amend the General Fund Expense Budget and add \$5000 to the Youth Camps/Retreats line item to cover costs of a winter retreat planned for December 2018.
- A Building Committee comprised of Chairman Frank Stanley, Gary Reynolds, Chris Olson, Kelly Houston, and Mike Dragoo was appointed to review plans for remodeling the west bathrooms and to recommend the course of action as to bidding/awarding a work contract for this project.
- Motion passed to allocate up to \$6000 for the purchase of new furnishings for rooms 200 and 202, in order to make them more like living rooms to accommodate G-3 Groups.
- Meeting adjourned; Next meeting, Tuesday, Sept. 18.
